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PROFILEBUDDY INTRODUCTION

ProfileBuddy Overview

ProfileBuddy™ is a tool in Buddy Media that enables you to create, edit and maintain custom Facebook tabs on a Facebook Page using sapplets. You can create one or more custom Facebook tabs to display with the native Facebook tabs on a Facebook Page. You can configure custom Facebook tabs using sapplets to create a unique Facebook experience.

- **Native Facebook tab** – A native Facebook tab is a tab that is included on a Facebook Page when the Page is created. Photos, Likes and Events are examples of native Facebook tabs.
- **Custom Facebook tab** – A custom Facebook tab is a customizable tab that you can add to any Facebook Page. It is a further destination for Facebook users who visit your Page. You can configure a Facebook tab using one or more sapplets in ProfileBuddy.
- **Sapplet** - A sapplet is a mini social application that enables you to configure the content on custom Facebook tabs. You can add one or more sapplets to a Facebook tab. Video, Ratings, Photo Gallery and Form Builder are examples of sapplets.

Log In and Navigate to ProfileBuddy

To log in and navigate to ProfileBuddy, take the following steps:

1. Navigate to your unique URL for Buddy Media. Enter your unique username and password combination.
2. Click **Login**.

- From the top navigation bar, click **ProfileBuddy**. The landing page of ProfileBuddy lists all of the Facebook Pages to which you have access.



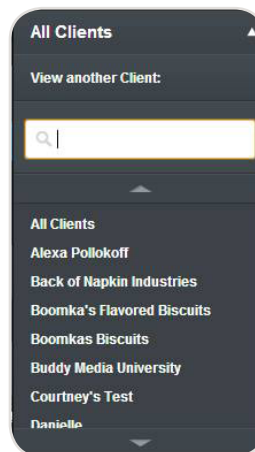
Navigation Bar

Filter ProfileBuddy

You can filter ProfileBuddy by client to display the Facebook Pages only for the specified client. To filter ProfileBuddy by client, take the following steps:

- Below the top navigation bar, click **All Clients**.
- In the search bar, type the name of a client.
- Below the search bar, select the desired client from the list of clients. Only the Facebook Pages for the selected client will display.

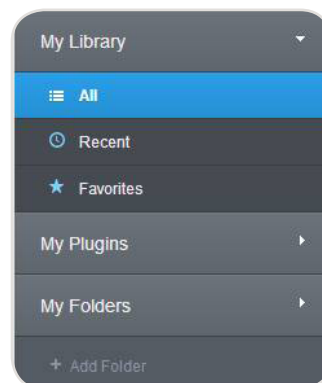
Note – After selecting a client, the All Clients button repopulates with the name of the selected client.



All Clients

If you have access to more than one Facebook Page, you can segment ProfileBuddy by one or more Facebook Pages to assist with navigation. You can view Facebook Pages by Recent, Favorites or My Folders. To filter ProfileBuddy by one or more Facebook Pages, take the following steps:

1. From the left side bar, click **My Library**. You can segment Facebook Pages by Recent or Favorites.
 - Click **Recent** to view all Facebook Pages that you have edited tabs for in the past 30 days.
 - Click **Favorites** to view all Facebook Pages that you have tagged as Favorites. To tag a Facebook Page as a Favorite, in the list of Facebook Pages to which you have access, to the left of the Page name, click the star icon.
2. Click **My Folders** to create and view a list of folders that you have created. Only Facebook Pages assigned to a specific folder will display. Click **+Add Folder** to create a new folder.
 - To add a Facebook Page to a folder, in the list of Facebook Pages to which you have access, to the left of the Page name, mouse over the three horizontal lines icon to display a four sided arrow. Click and drag a Facebook Page to the desired folder.



Segment Facebook Pages in ProfileBuddy

A Facebook Page can have one or more Facebook tabs, and one or more versions of each Facebook tab. A Facebook tab version is the design of a Facebook tab displayed when a user clicks a tab on a Facebook Page. The tab version displayed is based on a user's language settings and location. Language is determined by the language a Facebook user selects on their Facebook profile. Location is determined by the IP address from which the Facebook user logs in.

To navigate to a tab version, take the following steps:

1. To the left of a Facebook Page name, click the black arrow to display a list of Facebook tabs and tab versions.
 - **GL Global** is the default tab version for a Facebook tab. Every Facebook tab has a GL Global tab. This tab version will display the same content to all Facebook users, regardless of their language settings or IP address.



You can create unique tab versions to display for users who have specific language settings or are logging in from a specific IP address. In the image below, Boomka's Cheese Biscuits Facebook Page has a Facebook tab called Boomka's Cheese Biscuits. This tab has three versions:

- **GL Global** – This tab version will display for all users who do not meet the criteria of the two other tab versions.
- **US English** – This tab version will display for all users who log in from an IP address in the United States and have English as their selected language setting.
- **CA English** – This tab version will display for all users who log in from an IP address in Canada and have English as their selected language setting.

Note – For more information on setting up tab versions, reach out to your Marketing Cloud Success Manager, or log a ticket with Marketing Cloud Support.

2. Click a tab version name to navigate to the tab. Or, click the Mobile tab version icon or Desktop tab version icon to navigate to the tab version associated to the specific device.

- **Mobile tab version** – You can create a unique tab version for users visiting the tab from a mobile device.
- **Desktop tab version** – You can create a unique tab version for users visiting the tab from a desktop device.



Facebook Tabs

Facebook Tab Navigation Bar

You can use the Facebook tab navigation bar to navigate between the different sections of a Facebook tab. The navigation bar includes:

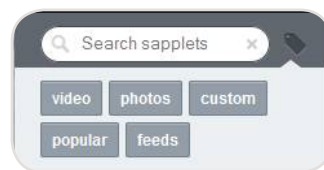
- **Layout** – Display the content editing section of a Facebook tab.
- **Design** – Update the Themes, Styles and CSS of a Facebook tab.
- **Settings** – Update the settings of a Facebook tab.
- **Preview** – See how a Facebook tab will display on Facebook before publishing.

Layout

The Layout section of a Facebook tab displays the content editing section of a Facebook tab. You can use this section to add, move, hide, show and remove sapplets from a Facebook tab. Sapplets display in a list on the left side of the screen. They are listed in alphabetical order. You can also add and remove Columns and Rows to organize sapplets on a Facebook tab. To navigate the Layout, you can choose from the following options:

To search sapplets, take the following step:

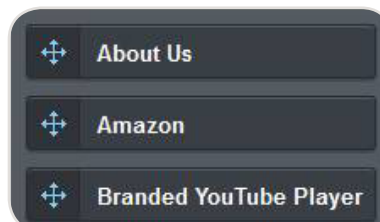
- On the left side rail, type the name of a sapplet into the Search sapplets bar. This will filter the list of sapplets to only display sapplets that include the letters in the search bar. Or, to the right of the Search sapplets bar, mouse over the tag icon to display a list of sapplet categories. Click a category to display sapplets in that category. Categories include: video, photos, custom, popular and feeds.



Search and Filter Sapplets

To add a sapplet to a Facebook tab, take the following step:

- To the left of a sapplet, click the four sided arrow and drag the sapplet to the Facebook tab.

To move a sapplet to a new location on a Facebook tab, take the following step:

- In the top left hand corner of the sapplet, click the four sided arrow and drag the sapplet to a new location.



Move a Sapplet

To customize the content of a sapplet on a Facebook tab, take the following step:

- At the bottom of a sapplet, click **Content**. Description, photo, category and name are examples of content you can customize.

To customize the settings of a sapplet on a Facebook tab, take the following step:

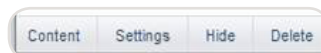
- At the bottom of the sapplet, click **Settings**. Feed Settings, Comment Settings, Fan Only Settings and Ratings are examples of settings you can customize.

To minimize a sapplet from view on a Facebook tab, take the following step:

- At the bottom of the sapplet, click **Hide**. When a sapplet is hidden from view, Hide repopulates as Show. Click **Show** to display a sapplet on the tab.

To remove a sapplet from a Facebook tab, take the following step:

- At the bottom of the sapplet, click **Delete**. Deleting a sapplet removes it permanently, along with all configuration options on the sapplet.



Sapplet Options

You can add and remove rows and columns to assist with the configuration of a Facebook tab. To add and remove rows and columns, take the following steps:

1. At the bottom of the list of sapplets, click **+Row** to add more rows to the tab and click **+Column** to add more columns to the tab.
2. When 2 or more rows or columns have been added to a tab, **-Row** and **-Column** display at the bottom of the list of sapplets. Click **-Row** to remove rows, and click **-Column** to remove columns from a tab.

Design

You can use the Design section of ProfileBuddy to customize the appearance of a Facebook tab. You can update the background and border colors, font size and color or use CSS to update the appearance of a Facebook tab. The Design section has 3 subsections – Themes, Styles and CSS.

Theme is the appearance of the Facebook tab. You can choose from a list of preset Themes that contain default settings for the Background and Border of a Facebook tab. Or, you can customize the Background and Border by uploading an image from your computer.

- **Background** – You can customize the Page Background, Header Background and/or Sapplet Content Background with unique colors or images. The Page Background is the border on the outside edge of all sapplets on the tab. The Header Background is the background of the title of each sapplet on the tab. The Sapplet Content Background is the background of all sapplets on the tab. To update one or more of the backgrounds of a Facebook tab, you can choose from the following options:
 - **Color** – You can customize the background by selecting a unique color from the color palette.

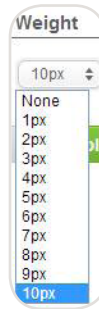


Color Pallete

- **Image** –You can customize the background by uploading an image from your computer.
- **Repeat** – You can customize the layout of the background image using the Repeat drop-down menu. Repeat enables you to display one or more versions of the image on the background. Select Tile to display multiple versions of the image throughout a background. Select Vertically to display multiple versions of the image in one row at the top of a background. Select Horizontally to display multiple versions of the image in one column at the far left of a background. Or, select None to display one version of the image in the top left hand corner of a background.



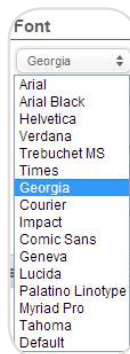
- **Borders** – You can customize the Borders around each sapplet in a Facebook tab with a unique color and width. To update the appearance the Borders, you can choose from the following options:
 - **Color** – You can customize the Borders by selecting a unique color from the color palette.
 - **Weight** – Customize the width of the Borders using the Weight drop-down menu. Select from 1 to 10 pixels, or select None to remove the Border.



Weight

Styles enable you to update the font on a Facebook tab. You can customize the text of four different Elements on a tab: Page, Header, Sub Header and Links. The Page text is all text that does not fall into one of the other three Elements. The Header text is the name of the sapplet, displayed at the top of each sapplet. The Sub Header text is the text that displays below the Header. The Links text is the text of the link displayed on the sapplet.

- **Font** – Customize the Font type by selecting an option from the Font drop-down menu. Select 1 of 16 font options.



Font

- **Size** – Customize the Size of the Font by selecting from the Size drop-down menu. Select from 8px to 60px.



- **Format** – Customize the style of the text by selecting from the Format options – Bold, Italicize and/or Underline.



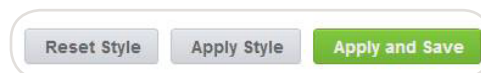
Format

- **Color** – Customize the text color by selecting a unique color from the color palette.

CSS stands for Cascading Style Sheets. It is front end code for your sapplets that calls out to the different sapplets on your tab and determines how the sapplets are displayed. You can use CSS to update the color of a sapplet, positioning of a sapplet or the placement of a button on a sapplet.

At the bottom of the Design section, you can choose from the following options to save or reset the changes:

- **Reset Style** – Click Reset Style to return to the previous Design settings, from the last time you saved.
- **Apply Style** – Click Apply Style to view the Design settings without saving.
- **Apply and Save** – Click Apply and Save to save the Design settings.



Reset or Save Settings

Settings

Settings enable you to update the Disable Publishing, Public URL, Fans Only and Session Timeout of a Facebook tab. To update the Settings for a Facebook tab, you can choose from the following options:

- Check or uncheck **Disable Publishing**. This will prevent all users from publishing changes to a canvas.



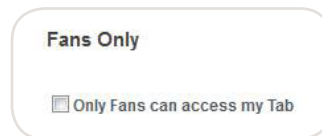
Disable Publishing



- The Public URL automatically redirects users to the desktop or mobile tab version based on the user's device. Use this URL to distribute your Facebook tab when targeting both Desktop and Mobile users.
- Select or deselect **Only Fans can access my Tab**. This is the image a Facebook user would see if they navigate to your Facebook tab and are not a fan of your Page.

Note – Selecting Only Fans can access my Tab overrides the other Fan Only Settings selected at a sapplet level.

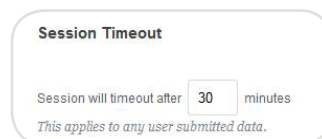
- Fans Only Settings enable you to set a fan-gate. A fan-gate prompts fans to like your Facebook Page before they can see the tab, using an image with a call to action or another piece of unique content. Select or deselect Only Fans can access my Tab. This is the image a Facebook user would see if they navigate to your Facebook tab and are not a fan of your Page.



Fans Only

- Insert **Fan only HTML**. This enables you to add a fan-gate using HTML code.
- Click **Browse** to select a Fan only image from your computer. This image will display for users who are not fans of your page.
- In the **Session will timeout after** field, type the number of minutes a Facebook user has to enter their information into a sapplet. The Session Timeout is the time limit for any sapplet that requires user submitted data, such as the Form Builder sapplet.

Note – If your Facebook tab does not contain one or more sapplets that require a user to submit data, the Session Timeout setting will not affect other sapplets on the tab.



Session Timeout

Once you have selected the desired options from the above settings, click **Save**.



Preview

In the top navigation bar, click **Preview**. Preview enables you to view how a Facebook tab will display to users before you publish it to Facebook.

Note – The preview section is functional. You can complete actions on any sapplet, similar to how a Facebook user would complete the actions, such as play a video, complete a quiz or fill out a form.

- **Width** – You can select a Width for the Facebook tab – 520px or 810px. 810px is the default width.
- **Facebook Preview** –Click **Facebook Preview** to navigate to a Facebook preview link created by Buddy Media. This enables you to preview the Facebook tab in a Fan or Non-Fan format before publishing the tab to Facebook. You can share this URL with anyone (regardless whether they have access to Buddy Media) so they can preview how the Facebook tab will display before publishing.

Publishing a Facebook Tab

Any changes you make to a Facebook tab will not display live on Facebook until you publish them. To publish a tab, you can choose from one of two options:

- **Publish Now** – At the top right hand corner of ProfileBuddy, click Publish Now to publish the most current version of the tab live to Facebook.
- **Schedule Publish** – At the top right hand corner of ProfileBuddy, to the right of Publish Now, click the arrow to open the Schedule Publish window. You can select a date and time to publish the most current version of the tab live to Facebook.



Publish Now

Note – When you select Schedule Publish a message will display the date and time when the tab will be published. Click Edit to update the date and time, or click Cancel to stop the Schedule Publish.

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SHORT CODES

Using Short Codes in ProfileBuddy

In ProfileBuddy, you have the ability to use short codes within a sapplet's Feed Settings to customize the type of messaging a user will see when they share out your content on Facebook. Below is a list of available short codes and examples of how they can be implemented. You can apply these short codes in the Caption section within Feed Settings for any sapplet with share functionality.

Feed Settings

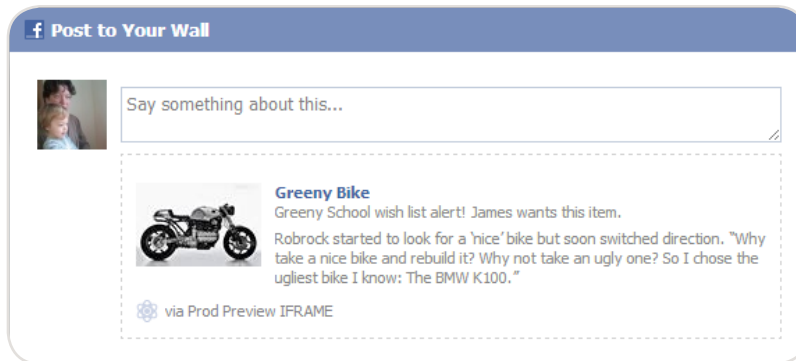
All Sapplets

All sapplets with share functionality can use the following short codes:

- **{*actor*}** – pulls in the first name of the user sharing the content.
- **{*fanpage_name*}** – pulls in the name of the Facebook page that the content is shared from.

Examples

- `{*actor*}` shared this image from the `{*fanpage_name*}` page.
- `{*fanpage_name*}` wish list alert! `{*actor*}` wants this item.
- Check out this awesome Puzzle that `{*actor*}` found from the `{*fanpage_name*}` page.

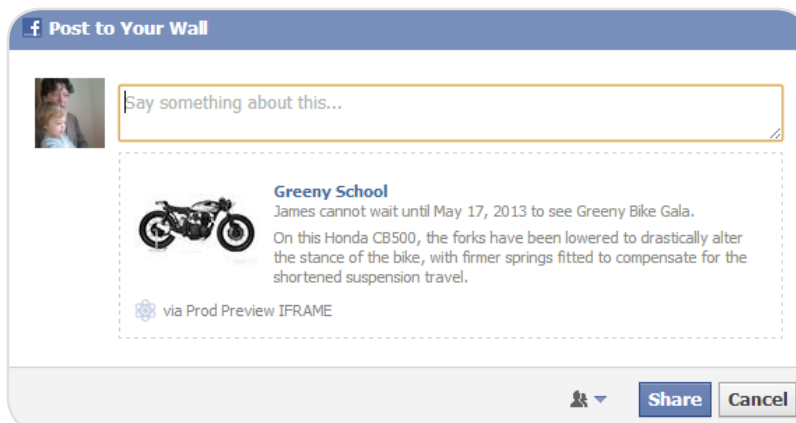
My Plans Sapplet

The My Plans sapplet can use the following short codes:

- `{*user_answer*}` – pulls in a user's selected answer.
- `{*selected_date*}` – pulls in the date selected by a user.

Examples

- `{*actor*}` is getting ready to go on a trip to `{*user_answer*}` on `{*selected_date*}`.
- `{*actor*}` is attending the `{*user_answer*}` on the night of `{*selected_date*}`.
- `{*actor*}` cannot wait until `{*selected_date*}` to see `{*user_answer*}`.

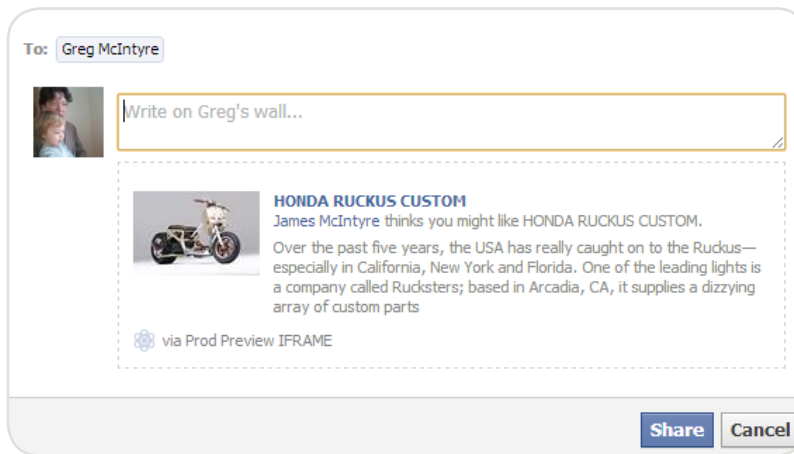
Gifts Sapplet

The Gift sapplet can use the following short codes:

- `{*gift_name*}` – pulls in the name of the gift the user selected.

Examples

- `{*actor*}` sent you: `{*gift_name*}`.
- `{*actor*}` is dropping you a not-so-subtle birthday gift hint with this `{*gift_name*}`.
- `{*actor*}` thinks you might like `{*gift_name*}`.

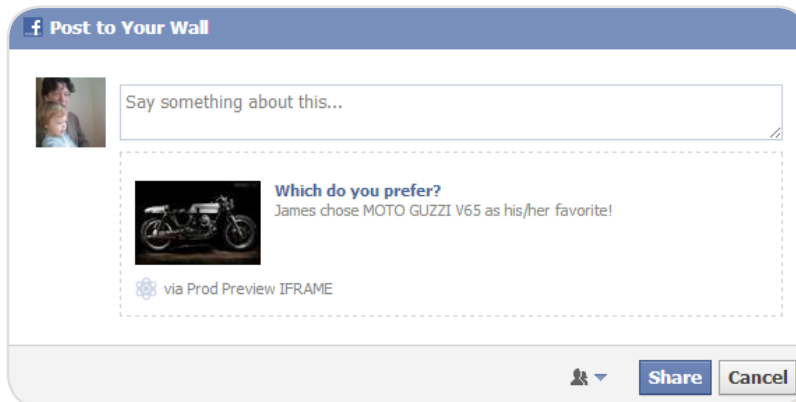
Poll Sapplet

The Poll sapplet can use the following short codes:

- `{*user_answer*}` – pulls in the answer a user selects.

Examples

- `{*actor*}` answered `{*user_answer*}`
- `{*actor*}` thinks `{*user_answer*}` is the best!
- `{*actor*}` chose `{*user_answer*}` as his/her favorite!

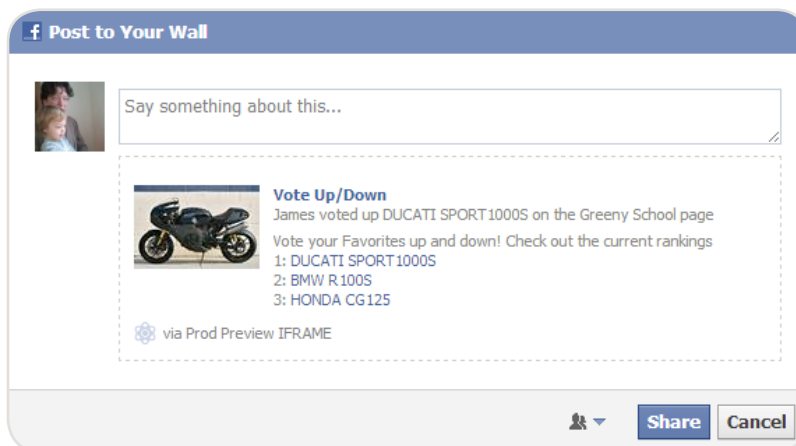
Vote Up/Down Sapplet

The Vote Up/Down sapplet can use the following short codes:

- `{*item*}` – pulls in the item voted up or down by a user.

Examples

- `{*actor*}` voted up `{*Item*}` on the `{*fanpage_name*}` page.
- `{*Item*}` just got a popularity boost on `{*fanpage_name*}`.
- `{*actor*}` just exercised his right to vote with `{*Item*}`.
- Ouch! `{*actor*}` just voted `{*Item*}` down on the `{*fanpage_name*}` page.

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ABOUT US SAPPLET

Overview

The About Us sapplet enables you to display basic information about your business on your Facebook tab. You can customize a unique About Us sapplet to let Facebook users know key information about your organization. You can use this sapplet to list your location, contact information and a description.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the About Us sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the About Us sapplet onto your tab.
2. Click **Content**.
3. In the Business Name field, type the name of your organization. This name displays at the top of the sapplet.

4. In the Address field, insert the address for your organization (optional).
5. In the Address 2 field, insert additional address information for your organization (optional).
6. In the City field, insert the city where your organization is located.
7. In the State drop-down menu, select the state where your organization is located (optional).
8. In the Country drop-down menu, select the country where your organization is located (optional).
9. In the Zip Code field, insert the Zip Code for your organization (optional).
10. In the Website URL field, insert the URL for your organization (optional).
11. In the Main Phone field, type the phone number for your organization (optional).
12. In the Fax field, insert the fax number for your organization (optional).



13. In the Hours field, insert the business hours for your organization (optional).
14. Select or deselect **Visa**. This displays Visa as a payment option on the sapplet (optional).
15. Select or deselect **Mastercard**. This displays Mastercard as a payment option on the sapplet (optional).
16. Select or deselect **American Express**. This displays American Express as a payment option on the sapplet (optional).
17. Select or deselect **Discover**. This displays Discover as a payment option on the sapplet (optional).
18. Select or deselect **Check**. This displays Check as a payment option on the sapplet (optional).

19. In the Logo field, click **Browse** to upload an image from your computer. The Logo displays below the Short Description (optional).
20. In the Short Description field, type a description related to your organization. The Short Description displays below the Business Name at the top of the sapplet (optional).
21. Click **Save**.



Edit Settings

To edit the Settings of the About Us sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, click **Settings** on the About Us sapplet.
2. Edit desired settings.
3. Click **Save** when complete.

Note – All selections in Edit Settings are optional.

Comment Settings

To edit the Comment Settings on the About Us sapplet, you can choose from the following options:

- Select or deselect **Allow User to Comment**. This will display a comment box under the About Us sapplet.
 - **Instructions** – Enables you to customize the title above the comment box.
 - **Number of Comments to Show** – Enables you to customize the number of comments to display at the bottom of the About Us sapplet.
 - **URL to comment on** – Enables you to determine the URL that the comment links back to. The URL will display below the comment in the user's timeline. Select Use Canvas URL to link the comment back to the Facebook tab. Or, select Define URL to customise the URL.
 - **Comments Theme** – choose from Light, Dark or Transparent.
 - **Background Color** – Select a color from the color palette displayed.

Fan Only Settings

To adjust the Fan Only Settings, you can choose from the following options:





- Select or deselect **Fan Only**. You can specify that only fans are able to view your sapplet.
 - Click **Browse** to select a Non-Fan Image. This is the image users who are not fans will see.
 - Insert Non-Fan HTML. This enables you to add a fan-gate using HTML code.

Global Settings

To adjust the Global Settings, you can choose from the following options:

- View the Sapplet Version.
- Select or deselect **Hide Sapplet Header**. This will remove the header and title from the sapplet.
- Insert a Sapplet Title.
- Modify the CSS ID. The CSS ID is an alphanumeric string preferred with no spaces or special characters.

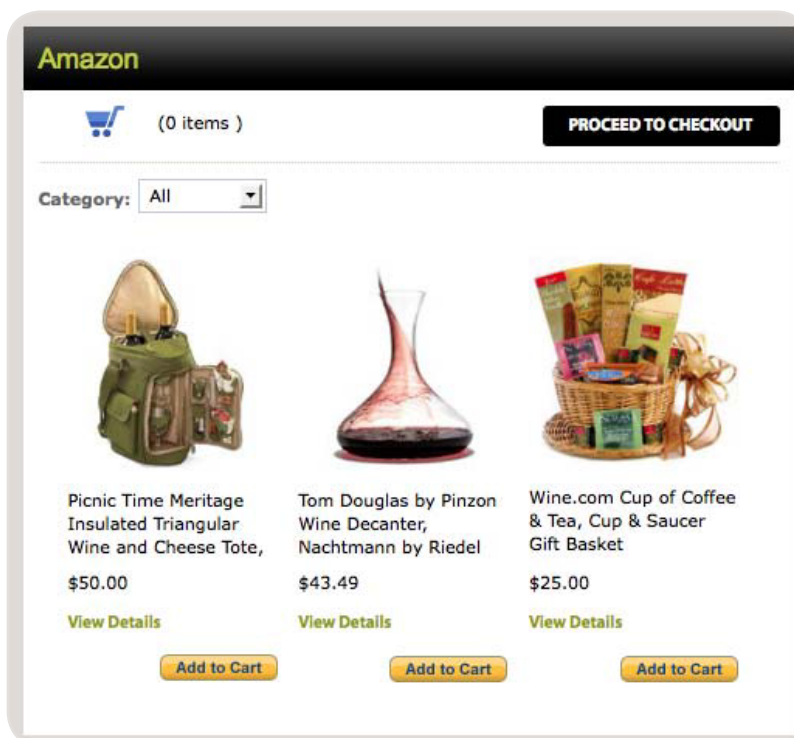

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AMAZON SAPPLET

Overview

The Amazon sapplelet makes it easy for fans to shop from your Facebook Page. You can attract fans to your content by displaying a wide variety of items within the sapplelet and provide brief descriptions of your products. Users can fill their carts with their favorite items and customize their orders directly from Facebook. When users are ready to complete their transaction, they are taken directly to the point of purchase on Amazon.com to complete their orders.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the Amazon sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Amazon sapplet onto your tab.
2. Select **Content**.
3. Click **+ Add Item**.
4. In the Amazon ID field, type your Amazon ID. The Amazon ID is used to track qualifying purchases made by your site visitors when you link to Amazon. It pulls in an image, product description and price from Amazon.

5. In the Product Name field, type the name of the product you are selling.
6. In the Product Category field, type the name of the category to which the product is associated.
7. Click **Save**.

Edit Settings

To edit the Settings of the Amazon sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, click **Settings** on the Amazon sapplet.
2. Edit desired settings.
3. Click **Save** when complete.

Basic Settings

To edit the Basic Settings of the Amazon sapplet, you can choose from the following options:

- In the Which country are your products available in? drop-down menu, select the country from which your products are available.

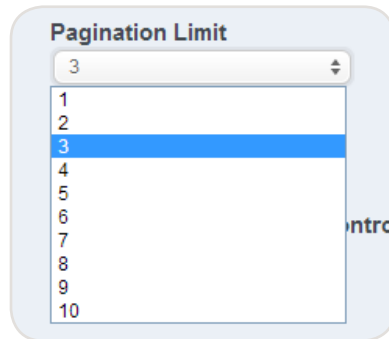
- In the Associate Tag field, type your Amazon Associate Tag. The Associate Tag allows you to earn revenue on purchases. If you do not have an Associate Tag, click [here](#) and fill out a short application on Amazon.
- In the Cart Instructions field, type the directions on how to complete the transaction.

Cart Instructions

To complete your purchase, click "Proceed to Checkout." You will be taken to Amazon to complete your purchase.

Cart Instructions

- In the Custom Name for Add to Cart field, type custom text that will appear on the Add to Cart button. The default is Add to Cart.
- Check **Feature First Product** to display the selected item at the top of the list.
- In the Items Per Page field, type the total number of items to display per page on the sapplet.
- In the Pagination Limit drop-down menu, select the total number of pages of products to display. Choose from 1- 10.



Pagination Limit

- Check **Show Share Buttons** to display the Facebook Share Buttons on the sapplet.
- Check **Show Advancement Controls** to add navigation functionality to the sapplet. This enables a user to click Next and Previous to navigate between pages of Amazon products.
- Check **Show All Category** to display the All option in the Product Category drop-down menu.
- In the Width of Modal (ex. 500px) field, type the width of the product detail and shopping cart modal windows in pixels.

Item Comments Settings

- Select or deselect to **Allow User to Comment on Individual Items**. This will display a comment box under each product displayed on the Amazon sapplet:
 - **Instructions** - Enables you to customize the title above the Comment box.
 - **Number of Comments to Show** - Enables you to customize the number of comments to display under each item.
 - **Comments Theme** - Choose from Light or Dark.
 - **Background Color** - Select a color from the color palette displayed.

Item Feed Settings

To adjust the Item Feed Settings on the Amazon sapphire, you can choose from the following options. These options will display when a user selects the Facebook Share button from the Item:

- Insert a Story Name. A Story Name is the title of the post.
- Insert a Caption. A Caption is a subtitle for the post describing why the user posted the item or the action the user took.
- Insert a Description. A Description is text summarizing the story.
- Insert a Link. A Link is the URL to which the post links.
- Insert a Picture. A Picture is the image displayed in the post.

Cart Feed Settings

To adjust the Cart Feed Settings on the Amazon sapphire, you can choose from the following options. These options will display when a user selects the Facebook Share button from the Cart:

- Insert a Story Name. A Story Name is the title of the post.
- Insert a Caption. A Caption is a subtitle for the post describing why the user posted the item or the action the user took.
- Insert a Description. A Description is text summarizing the story.
- Insert a Link. A Link is the URL to which the post links.
- Insert a Picture. A Picture is the image displayed in the post.

Fan Only Settings

To adjust the Fan Only Settings, you can choose from the following options:





- Select or deselect **Fan Only**. You can specify that only fans are able to view your sapphire.
 - Click **Browse** to select a Non-Fan Image. This is the image users who are not fans will see.
 - Insert Non-Fan HTML. This enables you to add a fan-gate using HTML code.

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CALENDAR SAPPLET

Overview

The Calendar sapplet provides an excellent method for notifying your users of important upcoming events. The sapplet enables you to embed an existing calendar on your Facebook Page for users to view and interact with. The benefits of embedding your existing calendar on your Facebook Page are engaging with your fans and notifying these fans of brand events they can attend and share with their friends.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the Calendar sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Calendar sapplet onto your tab.

You can customize the user information collected through a combination of text, radio buttons, check boxes, images, date and location fields. You can export the data collected in the Analytics section of Buddy Media.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the Form Builder sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Form Builder sapplet onto your tab.
2. Click **Content**.
3. Click **+Add Item**.

4. In the Display Name field, type a name for the item on the sapplet. The Display Name will appear above the Field Type on the sapplet.

Note – The Display Name is the name a Facebook user will see on the sapplet.

5. In the Variable Name field, type a name for the item. The Variable Name is used to identify data after it has been collected.

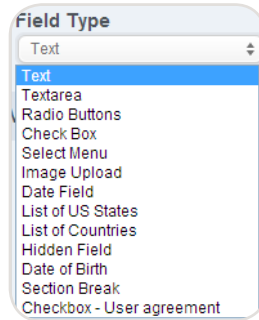
Note – The Variable Name is the name that displays on the spreadsheet when you export the form submissions in the Analytics section of Buddy Media. It is not visible to Facebook users. The Variable Name can not contain spaces.

6. In the Field Type drop-down menu, select a type of field to display on the sapplet. The Field Type you select determines the options available to users. The Content options will change depending on the Field Type you select. You can customize your form by adding one or more Field Types to a sapplet.

- Select or deselect **Required**. By selecting Required, a Facebook user must complete the actions before they can submit the form (optional).

- In the Minimum Characters field, type the minimum number of characters a user must enter before they can submit the form (optional).
- In the Data Validation drop-down menu, select a Data format. The Data Validation enables you to require that users enter the text in a designated format before they can submit the form (optional). You can choose from one of three options:
 - **None** – Select this option to enable users to enter text in any format.
 - **Email** – Select this option to require that users enter text in an email format.
 - **Numbers Only** – Select this option to require that users enter text in a numerical format.

 - Select or deselect **Is Selected?**. This option preselects the Radio Button when the sapplet loads.
 - Click **Save**.

- Click **Save**.

Image Upload

Select the Field Type **Image Upload** to enable Facebook users to upload an image to the form. On the sapplet, the Facebook user can click Browse and select an image from their computer. The image displays on the sapplet before the user submits the form.

- Select or deselect **Required**. By selecting Required, a Facebook user must complete the actions before they can submit the form (optional).
- Click **Save**.

Note - When you use the image upload field type, you will see a tab for image moderation. The tab shows a list of the pending, approved, and rejected images along with details for each image. Approved images can be added to the Asset Library or exported with their corresponding data.

Date Field

Select the Field Type **List of Countries** to enable Facebook users to select a country from a drop-down menu.

- Select or deselect **Required**. By selecting Required, a Facebook user must complete the actions before they can submit the form (optional).
- In the Excluded from List field, type the name of one or more countries to exclude from the drop-down menu (optional).
- Click **Save**.

Hidden Field

Select the **Hidden Field** type to add a field to the form that only displays on the exported spreadsheet. The Hidden Field does not display on the applet and is not visible to Facebook users. For example, to assist with organization, you can use the Hidden Field to add an ID number or campaign name to the Form Builder applet.

- In the Value field, type the text that displays on the spreadsheet when the form submissions are exported.

Date of Birth

Select the Field Type **Date of Birth** to enable Facebook users to select their date of birth from drop-down menus; month, day and year.

Select the Field Type **Checkbox – User Agreement** to add a terms and conditions area to the Form Builder applet. You can require that Facebook users acknowledge that they have read and understand the terms and conditions before they submit the form.

- Select or deselect **Required**. By selecting Required, a Facebook user must complete the actions before they can submit the form (optional).
- Select or deselect **Disable checkbox until user scrolls through text**. Select this option to require that Facebook users scroll to the bottom of the User Agreement Text field before the Required checkbox is displayed.
- In the User Agreement Text field, type the text to display in a terms and conditions box on the Form Builder applet.
- In the User Agreement Field Height field, type a number to determine the height of the user Agreement Text field.
- In the User Agreement Field Width field, type a number to determine the width of the user Agreement Text field.

Note – If the User Agreement text overflows the text box, a scroll bar will display.



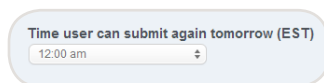

- **User can submit once a day** – Select this option to limit the number of times a Facebook user can submit the form to just once a day. In the Text Displayed after Limit is reached field, you can customize the text displayed after a user has submitted the form once a day. 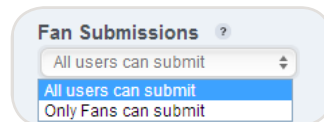

- **Store non-basic Facebook data** – Select this option to store all basic Facebook data and Non-basic Facebook data.

Note – You can view collected data by exporting a report in the Analytics section of Buddy Media.

Advanced Submit Methods


To edit the Advanced Submit Methods settings on the Form Builder applet, you can choose from the following options. Advanced Submit enables you to customize where the data submitted using the Form Builder applet is stored. It enables you to bypass Buddy Media servers and store the form data in a location of your choice.

- Select **Use Advanced Submit** to enable the Advanced Submit options.
 - In the Submit URL field, insert the URL for where the collected data is to be sent. This script should be hosted by you and written to expect each of the form's fields as a GET form element. Each field can be referred to by its corresponding Variable Name settings. This field is required when the Bypass Platform Server option is checked.
 - Select or deselect **Submit Using Post**. Select this option to submit the form using the POST method instead of the GET method. (Reminder: GET submits the form's data via the query string in the URL, and data is always submitted in the form of text. POST submits the form's data through the message body of the request. The data is not put into the query string of the URL.
 - Select or deselect **Bypass Platform Servers**. Select this option to bypass storing the user's form submission, including any personally identifiable information, on the Buddy Media server. This option requires that you provide a SUBMIT URL. If unchecked, form data can be retrieved from the system with no custom development. If checked, no data is stored on Buddy Media servers.
 - In the Encryption Password field, insert a password. This password will be combined with a timestamp of the form submission to verify data was provided through Buddy Media.

Comment Settings

To edit the Comment Settings on the Form Builder applet, you can choose from the following options:

- Select or deselect **Allow User to Comment**. This will display a comment box at the bottom of the Form Builder applet.
- **Instructions** – Enables you to customize the title above the comment box.

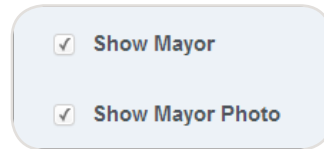

Overview

The Gifts sapplet enables users to send custom-branded digital gifts and personal messages to their Facebook friends. You can add up to 50 gift images per category or just use one gift to generate a single messaging strategy for your brand. You can use the Gifts sapplet to create unique designs:

- **Representational** - You can use this design with a single representational image that acts as a callout to the gift store, since no gifts are initially displayed. When the user clicks the More Gifts button, the Send Gifts window opens to display the full gift selection.
- **Literal** - You can use this design to display a selection of the gifts available in the sapplet. When a user clicks the More Gifts button, the Send Gifts window opens with the library of available gifts.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the Gifts sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Gifts sapplet onto your tab.
2. Select **Content**.
3. Click **+ Add Item**.
4. In the Gift Title field, type the title for the gift.
5. In the Gift Category field, type the category name for the gift.
6. In the Image field, click **Browse** to add an image.
7. In the Gift Link field, type the URL to attach to the gift. This enables you to determine the website that the gift links back to when a user clicks on the gift.
8. Click **Save**.

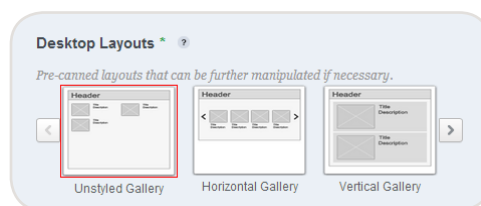

If more than one product is included in the sapplet, the lower navigation arrows displayed to the right and left of the image enable users to navigate to the next product. The top navigation arrows displayed to the right and left of the image enable users to navigate through the Additional Images for the product. The Detail Header and Description are displayed below the images.

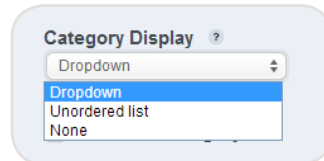

For example, you can build a Video sapplet, and then you can build a Testimonials sapplet to ask users a question about the video.



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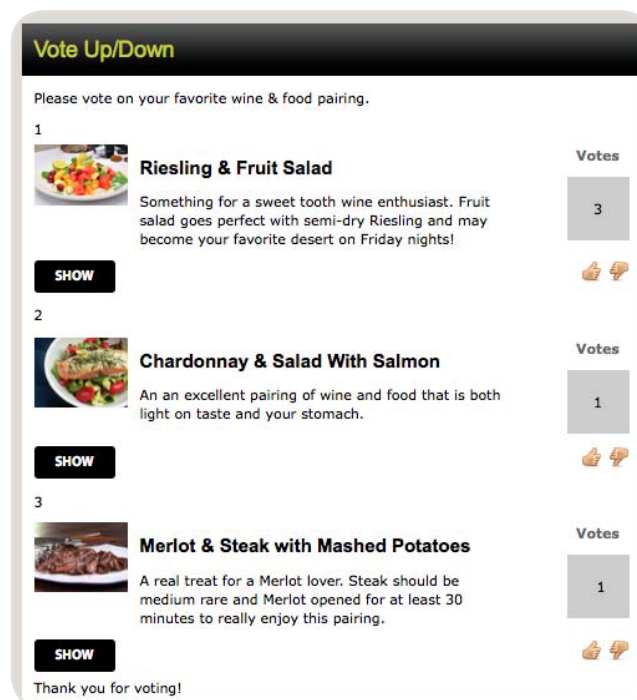

Users are able to indicate an affinity for your products and services directly on your Facebook tab. In addition, your fans can share your content with their friends once they have voted for their favorites.

You can use the Vote Up/Down sapplet to create:

- **Text and Image Assets** - Provide your fans with text and images of your content. Add a thumbnail image that users can see immediately, and add a larger image for each item to display more detail that users can show or hide.



Text and Image Assets

- **Text-Only Assets** - Users can vote in favor of or against descriptions of your products and services. This may be a viable option if you are limited on image assets.



Edit Content

To edit the content of the Vote Up/Down sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Vote Up/Down sapplet onto your canvas.
2. Select **Content**.
3. Click **+ Add Item**.
4. In the Image Title field, add a title. The title will appear to the right of the Thumbnail Image.
5. In the Image Thumbnail field, click **Browse** to add an image.
6. In the Image field, click **Browse** to add an image (optional). When you add an Image in this field, a user can click Show to display the selected image.

8. In the Image Link field, insert an Image Link (optional). An Image Link is an external link made available by clicking on the full sized image.

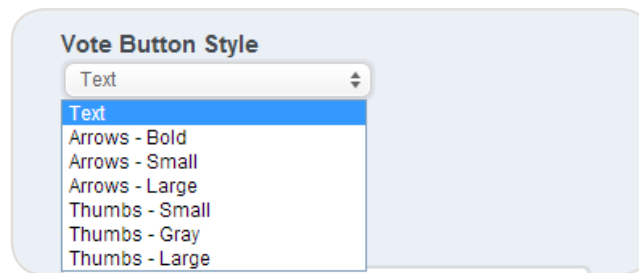

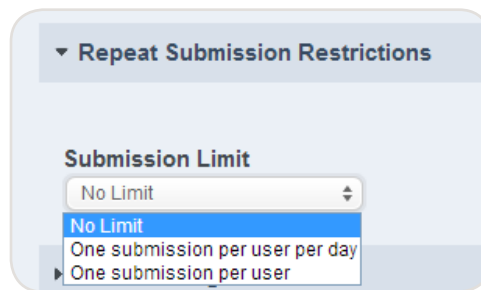

 - **One submission per user per day** - A user can only vote one time per day. In the Text Displayed after Limit is Reached field, enter the text that will display when a user reaches their limit of submissions for the day.
 - **One submission per user** - A user can only vote one time. In the Text Displayed after Limit is Reached field, enter the text that will display when a user reaches their submission limit.

5. In the List Label field, insert a name for your list of zip codes. This name displays if multiple lists are added to the sapplet.
6. In the Location Search Field Text field, customize the text displaying directly above the zip code search field on the sapplet. (optional)
7. In the CSV field, insert the desired list of zip codes and website URLs separated by commas. It is recommended to save your file as .csv file, then open it in a text file and paste it into the CSV field. The file should include zip code locations and redirect URLs, separated by commas. Be sure to exclude all headers.
8. In the Character Limit field, insert a numeric value limiting the number of characters a user may insert in the search field. (optional)

Note - The Character Limit is not suggested if using auto-complete search results; see Basic Settings.

9. In the Error Title field, customize the text that displays when the user searches for a zip code that is not included.
10. In the Error Message field, customize the message text that displays when the user searches for a zip code that is not included.

To edit the content of the Widget sapplet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the Widget sapplet onto your tab.
2. Click **Content**.
3. In the Placeholder Image field, click **Browse** to add an image. A user must click on the Placeholder Image to navigate to the embedded content on the sapplet.

4. In the Widget Embed Code field, insert the embed code for the content you want to link to the sapplet.
5. In the Content Width field, type a number to determine the width of the embedded content.
6. In the Content Height field, type a number to determine the height of the embedded content.

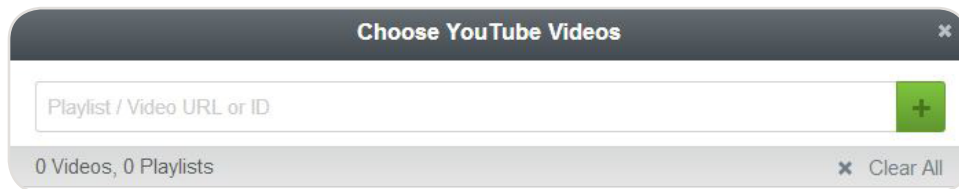

Within the sapple window, you can provide details to tell your fans what they will be watching, and even give them instructions to share their favorite videos. Videos play seamlessly on the Facebook Page through a YouTube RSS feed.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the YouTube sapple, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the YouTube sapple onto your tab.
2. Select **Content**.
3. Click **+ Add Item**.
4. Click **Choose Videos**.
5. In the Playlist/Video URL or ID field, insert the desired playlist's URL or the video's URL or ID.
6. Click the green (+) icon. Your video is added below.

7. Once you have added all required videos, click **Confirm Selection**.
8. In the Group Name field, insert the name for your group of videos.
9. In the Group Image field, click **Browse** to insert an image for your group.

- From the Thumbnails Placement drop-down menu, select the location in the sapplet to display the thumbnails of other videos.
- Select or deselect **Place thumbnails inside frame**. Displays six staggered video thumbnails for each video group. Users can click in an individual video to see a more standard player configuration.
- In the Thumbnails Width field, insert the desired width of individual thumbnails.
- Select or deselect **Display video titles on thumbnails**. This will display the original title of the video beneath each thumbnail.



- Select or deselect **Display video duration on thumbnails**. This will display the length of each video on each thumbnail in the sapplet.

Video Behavior

- Select or deselect **Autoplay videos that have been selected to watch**. This will automatically play the selected video without having to click play on the video.
- Select or deselect **Autoplay videos when a user lands on a page**. This will automatically play the first video when a user views your tab.
- Select or deselect **Show video title and description under the player**. This will display the video title and description.
- Select or deselect **Loop**. This will automatically play the next video in the video group.
- Select or deselect **Autohide controls**. This will hide the YouTube player controls when the user is not hovering over the player.
- Select or deselect **Show video count**. This displays the number of views in the lower left-hand side of the sapplet.

Share Settings

- Select or deselect **Show Share Button**.
 - Insert a Story Name. A Story Name is the title of the post.
 - Insert a Caption. A Caption is a subtitle for the post describing why the user posted the item or the action the user took.
 - Insert a Description. A Description is text summarizing the story.
 - Insert a Link. A Link is the URL to which the post links.
 - Click **Browse** to insert a Picture. The Picture is the image displayed in the post.
- Select or deselect **Show Tweet Button**.
 - In the Description field, insert the text to display. This text will appear in the tweet when the user clicks the Tweet button.
 - In the Link field, insert the desired link. This link will appear in the tweet when the user chooses to share.
- Select or deselect **Show +1 Button**. This will enable the user to share in Google+.

Fan Only Settings

To adjust the Fan Only Settings on the YouTube sapplet, you can choose from the following options:





- Select or deselect **Fan Only**. You can specify that only fans are able to view your sapplet.
- Click **Browse** to select a Non-Fan Image. This is the image users who are not fans will see.
- Insert Non-Fan HTML. This enables you to add a fan-gate using HTML code.

Global Settings

To adjust the Global Settings on the YouTube sapplet, you can choose from the following options:

- View the Sapplet Version.
- Select or deselect **Hide Sapplet Header**. This will remove the header and title from the sapplet.
- Insert a Sapplet Title.
- Modify the CSS ID. The CSS ID is an alphanumeric string preferred with no spaces or special characters.

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YOUTUBE GALLERY SAPPLET

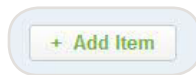
Overview

The YouTube Gallery sapperlet enables you to display multiple YouTube videos and/or playlists. You can also pull in the title and description directly from YouTube. This enables you to effectively reuse brand content from YouTube on Facebook.

Edit Content

To edit the content of the YouTube Gallery sapperlet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, drag the YouTube Gallery sapperlet onto your tab.
2. Select **Content**.
3. Click **+ Add Item**.

4. In the YouTube Video Pare URL field, insert the URL of the Video. Click **Get Data** to pull in the view title and descripton from YouTube.
5. In the Video Title field, insert the title of the video.
6. In the Thumb Caption field, insert the caption to display directly under the video.
7. In the Published Date field, insert the date the video was published. (optional)
8. In the Author Name field, insert the name of the author of the video. (optional)
9. In the Channel Link field, insert the URL of the channel to which you wish to direct users. (optional)
10. In the Video Description field, insert a description of the video.

Edit Settings

To edit the Settings of the YouTube Gallery sapperlet, complete the following steps:

1. On the Layout screen, click **Settings**.
2. Edit desired settings.
3. Click **Save** when complete.



Basic Settings

- In the Featured Video Width field, insert the desired width of the video in pixels.
- In the Featured Video Height field, insert the desired height of the video in pixels.
- Select or deselect **Allow users to share videos**. This displays the Facebook Share button on the sapplet.
- Select or deselect **Allow users to Like videos**. This displays the Facebook Like button on the sapplet.
- In the Expand Video Gallery Button Text field, customize the text displaying in the button.
- In the Collapse Video Gallery Button Text field, customize the text displaying in the button.

Feed Settings

To adjust the Feed Settings on the YouTube Gallery sapplet, you can choose from the following options. These options display when a user selects the Facebook Share button:

- Insert a Story Name. This is the title of the post.
- Insert a Caption. This is a subtitle for the post describing why the user posted the item or the action the user took.
- Insert a Description. This is text summarizing the story.
- Insert a Link. This is the URL to which the post links.
- In the Picture area, click **Browse**. This is the image displayed in the post.

Video Gallery Settings

- Select or deselect **Show Video Playlist Gallery**. This displays the gallery of available videos at the top of the sapplet.
- From the Max Rows Shown in Expanded View drop-down menu, select the desired number of rows to display.

Video Language Settings

- From the Like Button Language drop-down menu, select the desired language.
- In the Word In Pagination field, insert the desired word to display between the navigation arrows on the sapplet.
- In the Word Before Author field, customize the word displaying next to the author's name on the sapplet.



Comment Settings

- Select or deselect **Allow User to Comment**. This will display a comment box at the bottom of the YouTube Gallery sapplet.
- **Instructions** - Enables you to customize the title above the comment box.
- **Number of Comments to Show** - Enables you to customize the number of comments to display at the bottom of the YouTube Gallery sapplet.
- **URL to comment on** - Select from Use Canvas URL or Define URL. News stories on Facebook will link back to this URL.
- **Comments Theme** - Choose from Light or Dark.
- **Background Color** - Select a color from the color palette displayed.

Fan Only Settings

To adjust the Fan Only Settings, you can choose from the following options:





- Select or deselect **Fan Only**. You can specify that only fans are able to view your sapplet.
- Click **Browse** to select a Non-Fan Image. This is the image users who are not fans will see.
